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Retrospective

from Latin retrospectare meaning to "look back"

...at events that took place or work that was produced





Background of retrospectives

Where did they start?

- Origins in tech software development and project management teams
- Part of the Agile framework called Scrum
- Teams work in blocks of time called Sprints
- After 1-2 Sprints, a Scrum team will come together for a retrospective or a 'retro'





Defining a retrospective

What is a retrospective?

- Discussion session with relevant team members
- Allow teams to look back and reflect on the work they've completed
- Discuss what worked well and what didn't
- Decide on actionable improvements
- Create a plan for implementing ideas





Defining a retrospective

What is a retrospective <u>not</u>?

- A blame game they are not about pointing fingers
- A whinge-fest not focused solely on negatives
- Just another meeting in which talk is cheap but no change follows – they should produce actions that are actually actioned





Defining a retrospective

What do they look like?

- Team members meet, talk about stuff and agree on some actions – normally after a project or a set period of time (ie. 1 month, quarterly, mid-way through a project)
- Online, in-person or hybrid with the right tools
- As simple or as sophisticated as you need them to be







Benefits

What are some of the benefits?

- Celebrate the wins
- Explore new ideas
- Examine challenges
- Plan experiments or new ways of doing things
- Support continuous growth and improvement
- Answer questions
- Improve communication between team members
- Produce better quality work
- Create a sense of pride
- Promote team unity and trust
- Build better relationships







Retrospective Prime Directive



"Regardless of what we discover, we understand and truly believe that everyone did the best job they could, given what was known at the time, their skills and abilities, the resources available, and the situation at hand"




Setting up your retro

Ensure the retro is run by a person who is <u>not the project</u> <u>lead</u>.

Enable a safe environment to ask for feedback

- Psychological safety: a shared belief that the team is safe for interpersonal risk taking, team members feel accepted and respected. It can be defined as "being able to show and employ one's self without fear of negative consequences of self-image, status or career" (Kahn 1990)
- The purpose of the Feedback Loop/Retrospective is to inspect how the team is working together, identify potential improvements and create a plan for implementing them.





Setting up your retro

Growth mindset:

- welcome feedback and provide constructive feedback,
- failure is an opportunity to grow,
- learn from others,
- try new things,
- embrace challenges.

Inclusive space for all to have the freedom to speak up


- Be open and honest: This is a good way to improve parts of your project that aren't working so well.
- Focus on process/project improvement

Set an agenda

Give participants time to add their ideas to the retro board.


